






























1969 Dodge Dart Rat Rod Model Car (8/30/13-model, paint, decals, reeds)




My Car (current)









Mixed Media Art (7/17/13-metal,pint,glue,canvas)















Custom Cajon Drum (4/3/13-wood,glue,hardware)




Rubber Band Car (2/25/13-Metal, wood, fiberglass)









Oghma Infinium Book Cover (7/5/11-materials below)






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






Trebuchet (4/23/13-wood,plastic,metal,nylon)





















The Last Of Us "Clicker" Mask (6/29/14-foam,paint)







Disney Castle Capri-Sun Multimedia Painting (12/24/14-wood, Capri-Sun pouches, staples, paint)

English IV Final Project Poem


English IV Final Poem (1/9/15-canvas,paint,stencils)

You won't find a contention that's as cold,


But logic is what's used in my routine.

And it is Him that causes us to limp.




Snow Globe (12/18/12-glass jar,wood,cauk,mineral oil)














Duct Tape Wallets (10/7/12-duct tape, x-acto knives)














445nm 1W Altoids Can Laser (4/23/13-wood,plastic,metal,nylon)













The Phonograph

Product design has been implemented even since man created its first tools. One product design from the late 1800's has and will have an unprecedented impact even fifty years from now. In 1877 Thomas Edison unveiled what he called a Phonograph. As there had been products previous to this that produced music, there had not been one that recorded AND produced music. The phonograph started the ball rolling for the idea of playing recorded music through a device. In 1899, the first "jukebox" was designed and then we can skip ahead to the 1920's with the creation of the radio station. These products and ones that came later all had the same goal: getting music heard. And that correlates into today's society. With the progression of society comes the progression of music and vice versa.

Everything we do is affected by music in some way. In the 1950's Rock and Roll was born and with it came a new era of rebels that focused on un-conforming much like the previous "flappers" of the 1920's. Even now with what today's Rap music says and illustrates, it alters the way some young people act. Although there have been studies on how music affects us and that is common knowledge, for the most part those facts aren't understood by those who the music is affecting the most. We learn more about how to act in our younger ages than at any later point in

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our life. The ideas of having a product that makes wide-spread public music possible started when the phonograph inferred it was possible. Music acts as a type of propaganda if you will for young minds and even sometimes older minds. It's not just what we learn from music that affects us, but also how the music can affect our current mood. Soldiers during the Second World War didn't march out to the battlefield listening to Bach or Mozart; they marched out to strong and inspiring drum rudiments. This inspired them and filled them with the pride they needed to fight for their country. But the effects can be much more specific or radical than that.

With the current problems that are immanent to happen or are happening such as over-population of the earth and hurting the environment, changing the messages that are portrayed through music to combat these issues could be key to solving them. For example, Rap music in its music videos, a lot of the time, portrays enjoying life through the consumption of alcohol. This affects those who are listening to the music by suggesting the cool/hip way to have fun is by the consumption of alcohol. On the other hand, I often listen to classical music when I'm doing homework or anything else I need to get don't because I have found that it soothes me and makes it easier to focus. It is almost like a type of propaganda that can either be used positively or negatively. If the message in music starts to change then so will the minds of the people. Music is the voice of humanity. In a sense it can act as an "audio-photo album". This is seen in the 20's with its swing, the 80's with its techno pop; these are concrete examples of this idea. Music

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reflects the thoughts and ideas of people, and especially now a days it's becoming more important to get positive messages spread. Without the technology to be able to record and playback music, many of these thoughts, ideas, and emotions would be lost forever. "A picture is worth a thousand words", well songs are words.
